So hoping to come away with a couple points. I was talking to, well, John Kluppel always has the feeling that a good message is a one-point message, right, John?

If he can remember one thing, there's like three points in here, so if you remember one, that's great. I was talking to a guy yesterday, and I told him that. I said, you know, he said all these things he was going to say, and I said, you know, one-point messages oftentimes are good because I can take away something.
